



Mayor Perkins, I am writing you due to the current vehicle condition that the police department is facing. We have 8 officers that are sharing vehicles and this has caused a strain on our vehicle maintenance budget, due to the cars being driven without a break. In this upcoming budget, there is a request for 10 vehicles however, we are at the point where we can no longer afford to wait on the approval of the budget to order these much needed vehicles. I am requesting that we receive the approval to order the vehicles prior to the completion of the budget. However, after speaking with the bank they requested a current budget and the last two city audits. I spoke with three companies Stivers Dodge Prattville, Merchant Ford Selma and Brannen Motor Company Unadilla Ga.. Stivers stated that we would have to order the vehicles but assembly wouldn't start until November, Merchant Ford stated that they would try to locate some vehicles. Brannen of Georgia stated that they have 25 Ford Explorers on the lot and the total per vehicle with lights and sirens would be \$55,100 for a total of \$551,000.

#### Question# 5

Councilwoman James asked what is the status on the Performing Arts Center and if a Contractor has been chosen?

#### Answer

The Public Building Department has obtained a quote to repair the roof from Trotman Brothers Roofing and Construction, LLC for \$15,000 and \$105,000 to replace roof, if needed.

Also, a quote was received from Monumental Contracting Service for \$120,343 to repair.

I spoke with Steward Construction also and have not been able to connect to obtain a quote.

At this time, no contractor has been selected. Quotes with the scope of work are attached.

Public Buildings Department budget was \$75,000. Because of the condition of the buildings, and the plethora of continual repairs, my balance (as of 08/17/2023) is approximately \$1916.39.

The Public Buildings Department is recommending Monumental Contracting Service as the responsible bidder because all needed repairs are included and asking for the work to be paid in cash.

I am asking for a favorable vote so that we may move forward with getting the Performing Arts Center back in operation.

Downtown Selma, Alabama has for many years been a place of commerce, recreation and history. In order to continue the revitalization of the downtown area of Selma, drainage infrastructure improvements are necessary at this point prior to any planned improvements to the surface level infrastructure. This proposed project will focus on drainage improvements along Washington Street in downtown Selma between Selma Avenue and Water Avenue.

The project will include removal and replacement of damaged curb inlets along the project route, replacement of failed curb and gutter with modern Type-C curb and gutter and also the installation of two additional inlet structures strategically placed in the project area to greatly improve drainage in the area. This project scope is shown in the attached Project Activities Map.

The latest population figures for the City of Selma list it at 17,971. The median household income is \$26,581.





WHEREAS, the Act requires the municipal governing body of the City of Selma to adopt an Annual Transportation Plan no later than August 31 which shall provide a detailed list of projects for which expenditures are intended to be made in the next fiscal year and shall be based upon an estimate of the revenues anticipated from the fund in which the additional revenue is deposited during the next fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the Act further provides that any such funds shall be used only for the maintenance, improvement, replacement, and construction of roads and bridges maintained by the City of Selma and such other uses as are defined in the Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Selma as follows:

- The City Council of the City of Selma hereby passes this Resolution as its Transportation Plan submitted in compliance with the Rebuild Act, Act No. 2019-2.
- Pursuant to the Act, the City Council of the City of Selma estimates that its anticipated allocation from the Rebuild Alabama Act fund for the fiscal year will be approximately \$96,622, with increasing allocations for each fiscal year thereafter.
- 3. Pursuant to the Act, the City anticipates expending funds received pursuant to the Act, in part or in whole, to fund any of the following listed projects: Street Resurfacing Projects, Roadway Infrastructure Improvement caused by Cave-ins.
- 4. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and instructed to post a copy of this Resolution as its Transportation Plan in a conspicuous place at the County Courthouse, the City Hall, the County Highway Department and also on the website of the City of Selma.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Selma that, James Perkins, Jr., in his capacity as Mayor, is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with the Alabama Department of Revenue for the purpose of receiving these funds
